MINUTES

Town Council Work Session
Monday, August 16, 2021 at 6:00 pm

The media and public were duly notified of the date, time, and place of this meeting. A quorum was present.

COUNCIL PRESENT: Mayor Michael Bishop, Mayor Pro Tem Juston Ricard, Councilmembers Fecas, Hook, Reeley and Wilkerson.

COUNCIL ABSENT: Councilmember Steve Hallman

STAFF PRESENT: Municipal Clerk Leeann Eden, Chief of Police Andrew “Bear” Richbourg, Police Captain Chris Manuel, Attorney Ward Bradley, and Attorney Sierra Carini.

I. Call to Order

Mayor Bishop called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. A quorum was present. Mayor Pro Tem Ricard provided the invocation. Mayor Bishop led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. Consent Agenda

Council unanimously approved the August 16th, 2021 Work Session Agenda.

III. Presentations

A. Katie Colten, Member Engagement Manager for the National League of Cities – Onboarding and Opportunities to Engage. Ms. Colten provided Council with an overview of the benefits of membership with the National League of Cities, including but not limited to a service line home warranty program available to residents within the municipality, and a grant access program. Council thanked Ms. Colten for her presentation.

IV. Town Council Reports

A. Parrish Plantation. Mayor Bishop stated that Friday August 20th is the deadline for the developers of Parrish Plantation to respond to DHEC concerning plans for repairs of the pond dam. Attorney Bradley stated that DHEC is overtaxed at this time and pressure will need to be maintained for them to pay attention to the issues. Councilmember Fecas stated that a representative from DHEC’s Storm Water Division was taking pictures of the dam on August 6th. Mayor Bishop suggested setting up another meeting with DHEC to ask them not to permit another extension to the developers. Attorney Bradley stated that he will not take further action until instructed.

B. DOT. Councilmember Reeley stated that the road construction plates on Baywater Drive are loose and moving around. Mayor Bishop stated that the County has responsibility on Baywater Drive. Councilmember Reeley said that he will contact a County Councilmember about the issue. Councilmember Fecas stated she has observed DOT performing work orders in the area and they seem to be getting caught up.

C. Elected Officials. Councilmember Fecas discussed the Lexington Municipal Association meeting from last week. She stated that the President of the Association has been lobbying to legislature

concerning the funds from the American Rescue Plan. She stated that she sent a letter to the local delegation concerning the funds as well.

V. Adjourn

Council, on motion of Councilmember Wilkerson, seconded by Councilmember Fecas, voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 6:22 p.m.
